CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM

The University of Madras has introduced Choice Based Credit System in Undergraduate /Post Graduate courses from the Academic year 2008-2009. According to this system, the students are given various course options in which he/she can choose from. These are offered as Non-major electives and credits are allotted at the end of the semester (Nov /April) after the conduct of the University examinations.

Advanced Tamil/Basic Tamil is introduced for systematic learning of Tamil. Soft Skills is also introduced to increase the level of student's communication skills and confidence. Participation in Sports, NSS, Rotaract and other extension services is compulsory and credits are allotted.

The semester system with credits has evolved as the most popular and functional pattern of education across the globe.

Credit is the weightage given to what a teacher teaches and what a student learns. It is normally related to the number of hours a teacher teaches a particular subject. It is also related to the number of hours a student spends learning a subject or carrying out an activity.

Credit is a universally accepted or internationally recognized yardstick of assessment enabling students to move from one educational institution to another either within or outside the country.

Boys – cannot wear wrist band / ear rings / pierce the body anywhere with a stud.

No tattoo marks on the body should be exposed.

- All students must compulsorily wear ID card in campus. If a student loses ID card, the duplicate ID card will be issued on the payment of Rs.500/-.
- Students are asked not to possess or use mobile phones inside the college campus. Mobile phone if caught for the first time will be returned on payment of a fine of Rs.1,000/- . If he/she is caught the second time, sim card and the mobile phone will not be returned.
- Students are prohibited to take part in any political activity which is detrimental to the dignity of the college. They are not permitted to participate in live or photographic modeling, fashion shows, stage shows and or any TV programme without prior permission from the authorities.
- Student's misconduct in cyber space, social network, public places and while commuting in public transport shall invite stringent action.
- No student can conduct any meeting in the campus or collect money or distribute any pamphlets/brochures/notice or display any banner without the prior written permission of the Director / Principal/ Vice Principal.
- Any student found tampering or misusing the college ID card, library, train/bus pass, strict action will be taken.
- A minimum of 85% attendance is required to take up University examinations and to participate in other curricular and co-curricular activities. The students prevented for lack of attendance permanently, will have to redo the semester, allowing to attend the arrear exams only. Students caught for copying during examination will not be permitted to write the subsequent exams.
- Any change in parents' contact number/address should be notified only by the parent to the Department and College Office in the prescribed format which can be downloaded from the college website.

12. Students coming to college by two wheelers must possess a valid driving license. Four wheelers are not permitted. Students should park their vehicles in the parking area on payment of the parking lot fee of Rs.5/- on a daily basis and Rs.110/- monthly.
13. Any student taking a day's leave must take prior permission from the class teacher. Any student taking leave for more than a day should submit explanation letter to the Principal through Class teachers and concerned HOD's explaining the reason for his / her absence.
14. Any accident, chronic sickness or long leave on medical grounds should be reported to the Principal.
15. Ragging is strictly prohibited. Any student found guilty of ragging will be dealt with severely. Ragging is a punishable offence as per the Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Ragging Act. The college has provided a Black Box near the Principal's Office to drop your complaints.
16. Courteous behaviour towards teachers and authorities is expected from every patrician. If there is any violation, stringent action will be taken.
17. Damaging the college property or removal / breaking of any property belonging to the college, faculty or fellow students will lead to disciplinary action and the cost of repairs and replacement will be borne by the offender(s).
18. Any lawful / unlawful activity disrupting the peace inside the campus will lead to the expulsion of the student. Any student involved in criminal offence including the possession of Narcotics substances, alcohol, sharp weapons and any other harmful substance or items will not be allowed to continue his / her studies in the college.
19. No boy or girl should be found together in any isolated place or class room.
20. The college authorities can frame or modify disciplinary rules from time to time to regulate the conduct of the students inside and outside the college to maintain credibility and reputation of the institution. The decisions of the college authorities in regards to the disciplinary proceedings for indiscipline and other unlawful activities are final.

NOTE:

1. Periodic assessment will be conducted as per schedule given in the hand book. The student should compulsorily attend the same.
2. Parent teacher meeting will be held twice in a semester.

STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICE

CIVIL SERVICES CELL

A Civil Service cell has been initiated to help and guide the students for pursuing IAS/IPS/IFS.

TRAINING, PLACEMENT & CAREER GUIDANCE CELL

The Management of Patrician College of Arts and Science has taken special steps by introducing the Placement Cell and arranging for campus recruitments for the students. A large number of students secured placements during different selection camps organized for computer related, Accounts, and administrative jobs including Software Development, Testing, Business Transcription, Medical Transcription and Call Centre jobs in reputed companies like Wipro, HCL, Infosys, AJUBA, CTS, Airtel, TCS, TNQ, CSS Corp, QScience and RBS.

MENTORING

Mentoring is a valuable strategy to provide the students with the emotional and

instrumental support in the college. Each student of the college is counselled by the mentor. Mentors play an important role in providing guidance and encouragement. Mentors also address personal and medical issues of their mentees.

COUNSELLING:

The College nurtures students not only in terms of academic progression but also in their social and emotional needs.

Priority is given to physical and mental health of the students. Counseling and mentoring services are offered through professional counsellors available in the campus.

GRIEVANCE CELL

To maintain culture and discipline among the students the college has formed the Grievance Cell. Feedback and suggestions could be dropped in the green box and grievance in yellow box which is provided near the Principal's Office.

ANTI-SEXUAL HARASSMENT CELL

The college has constituted the Anti-Sexual Harassment Cell as per the Visaka guidelines given by the Supreme Court of India (1997). The Cell Committee comprises of a Non-Governmental Organisation (NGO) and a woman Teaching Staff and a woman non-teaching staff assisted by the student representatives. Any student found guilty of ragging would be punished with imprisonment if convicted. A black box is provided near the Principal's office for students to drop complaints related to Anti-Sexual harassment and ragging.

INTERNAL ASSESSMENT

Evaluation of students is based on two CA tests and one model exam in each semester. It is compulsory for the students to attend the model exam. These marks will be considered for internal marks.

STUDENTS SAFETY INSURANCE SCHEME

The college is implementing the accidental Insurance scheme of University of Madras. Compensation is provided to the students in case of accident and Reimbursement of hospitalization expenses is incurred.

SCHOLARSHIPS

POST MATRIC SCHOLARSHIP TO MINORITY STUDENTS

- Ministry of Minority Affairs has allotted religious minority scholarship to Tamilnadu for the year 2016 – 2017. Students who belong to Muslim, Christian, Buddhist and Parsi communities can apply for this scholarship.

- Students should be regular in attendance for which the yardstick will be decided by the competent authority of college/university.
- Students obtaining benefits under this scholarship scheme shall not be allowed to avail benefits under any other scholarship schemes.
- Only the student residents of Tamil Nadu will be entitled to scholarship under the quota of Tamil Nadu, irrespective of his/her place of study.
- Scholarship will be sanctioned strictly based on merit.
